Columbus Circle (intersection of Broadway, 59th St, & Central Park West) Manhattan. 10pm. Free

Lincoln Center of Performing Arts. Manhattan. 7pm. Free

From the Brooklyn Bridge to Central Park, along Park Avenue and connecting streets. 7am-1pm. Free

The city closes seven miles of Park Avenue and Lafayette Street to cars so you can play, run, walk, dance, and bike carefree during Summer Streets. Expect food, entertainment, and activities. nyc.gov

Hong Kong Dragon Festival:

Flushing Meadows Corona Park. Queens. 8am-5pm. Free

Over 180 teams gather at the lake in Flushing Meadows Corona Park on longboats. On land, you can join in the fun with Chinese music, martial arts demonstrations and vendors selling Asian cuisine. hkdbf-ny.org

First Saturday at the Brooklyn Museum:
