A BIT OF HISTORY

Evocative of an English cottage garden, this four-acre oasis in Central Park is densely planted with trees, shrubs, flowers, and herbs mentioned in William Shakespeare's plays and poems. Scattered throughout the Garden are bronze plaques with quotes from Shakespeare that reference plants.

It is fittingly located near the Delacorte Theater, the venue for the Public Theater's productions of Shakespeare in the Park. And is the perfect place to sit and relax. Or study!

3 COOL THINGS TO DO AFTER YOUR ENGLISH CLASS

1. This is a great opportunity to explore Central Park. There is so much to see here that you will probably need more than 1 visit. If you go North, you can take in Belvedere Castle, the Great Lawn, the Jackie Onassis Reservoir, the Ravine and don't miss the beautiful Conservatory gardens. If you exit the park after visiting the gardens, you could also visit the Museum of the City of New York, which is a great museum all about NYC. Highly recommended!
2. Alternatively head South, and visit the Ramble, the Bow bridge (the most famous bridge in the park), the Bethesda fountain, the iconic sheep's meadow, the mall, the pond and another famous bridge, the Gapstow bridge. Stop here for great photos of the city's tall buildings overlooking the park!
3. Head West out of the park, and take a chance to visit the American Museum of Natural History, one of the most famous museums in the city. You'll need several hours here. Afterwards, you can explore the Upper-West Side walking slowly down Amsterdam Avenue until you reach the Lincoln Center. This is a great place to see Jazz!
